

### **Rush Williamson Receives the** Trail of Fame Award Article by Jess LaPolla

PATC Supervisor of Trails, Rush Williamson, recently received the Trail

Presented by the Maryland Department of Natural Resources, this award recognizes and celebrates exemplary service and commitment to the improvement and maintenance of trails on our public lands.

Rush started working on the Catoctin Trail around 2002 as a member of the South Mountain Crew. After his 2008 AT thru hike, Rush became a Trail Maintainer on the Catoctin Trail. In 2012 he formed the Old Scouter Crew, which became a traveling Crew in the Maryland and Pennsylvania area, still primarily focused on the Catoctin Trail.

The Crew has grown from four to 11 regular crew members who meet on Thursdays. When the Maryland District split into the AT and Side Trails MD and Catoctin Districts in 2019, Rush became the District Manager of the Catoctin District.

According to Rush, "The award is largely based on the fact I lead the effort to go through the paperwork to restore the badly eroded trail going up Bobs Hill which will require 500+ steps, rolling grade dips, and check dams. We have been working on this project for about a year and at present put in around 258 structures, it is anticipated the work will be completed within the next year depending on the availability of timbers."



### **PATC Council Report** September 2024 Meeting



## From the Desk of Rick Canter Past President, Board Member 'The Friends'

It is a great time to be involved with the Friends of Cunningham Falls and Gambrill State Parks. We are engaged with the park staff, funding for park needs, getting our administrative tasks done and providing public-facing events.

On October 12, in the William Houck Area of Cunningham Falls Park, we held the latest in a series of "Hayrides and S'mores" events. Children...and some adults...cooked and ate S'mores over an open fire...and we gave participants a ride through the North Beach loop area. Half fundraiser, half educational event, everyone enjoyed a pleasant Saturday afternoon by the lake.

Later that evening, we held our second event of the day, this time in Gambrill Park's High Knob Scenic Area. "The Blair Witch Project" was projected in the open air on our silver screen; the perfect movie for combining the outdoors with some Halloween spookiness. We provided free popcorn and bottled water to our moviegoers. Over the last two summers, we have fielded several movie nights at the High Knob Scenic Area, and providing a spooky movie in October fit just right. Over 100 people attended our viewing of "Blair Witch".

It feels great to attract patrons to the parks for special events in the off-season. On a typical October 12, not many people would have been in either park, so it was nice to get folks out ...children and adults...enjoying our outdoor spaces.

If exercise was more your interest, we fielded the 9th annual Friends 10K / 5K and Fun Run-Walk on November 3. The 10K and 5K started simultaneously and the Fun Run- Walk was a leisurely untimed 1.4-mile stroll. All events were in the William Houck Area of Cunningham Falls State Park. The fall colors were just past peak and it was a beautiful if chilly morning in the park. Because the race course is spread out over most of the pavement of the William Houck Area, it was an "all hands on deck" event for volunteers and park staff in various locations of the lake area.

The Friends 10K / 5K enjoyed record attendance, with 202 total registrants. Records were broken in the 10K female, 5K female and 5K non-binary categories. We also had a 12-year-old girl win the 5K outright. We have many people to thank for making the Friends race such a success. We have our corporate sponsors, Charm City Run, Amber Hill Therapy Centers, VisitFrederick, and FirstEnergy. This was the first time our event was chip timed and the timing was performed by the Frederick Steeplechasers Running Club. Our MC for the event was Bill Susa of WF Running, and our photographer was Missy Grimes of Mindful Focus Photography. The Cunningham Falls Park rangers worked diligently alongside the Friends to ensure the safety and enjoyment of the running public. Finally, many runners donated to us online over and above the registration fee, and we are grateful to those runners who generously gave back to us for our efforts.

As we head into winter, the Friends will re-tool with nominations for 2025 Officers and Directors. Soon after, we will plan our biggest annual event, the Maple Syrup Festival, which will be held on March 8, 9, 15 and 16 in 2025.

We are grateful to serve the public through our Mission: To support and enhance the programs and recreational offerings of the parks. In 2025, we will continue to provide events, support park management and staff, and help protect the park amenities and environment we all enjoy.











